ENGAGE, ENCOURAGE, INFORM, EDUCATE AND COMMUNICATE

A comprehensive IEC strategy was adopted at Union Territory level to spread the awareness and sensitize the rural community.

Different strategies have been used on time to time as effective tools of communication around Solid Waste Management (SWM), Biodegradable Waste Management (BWM), Plastic Waste

Management (PWM), Liquid Waste Management (LWM), Greywater Management (GWM) and Faecal Sludge Management (FSM).

IEC strategies' special emphasis was also focused on the sustained toilet use, Operation and Maintenance of Individual Household Latrines (IHHLs), Community Sanitary Complexes (CSCs), Retrofitting of Single Pin to Twin Pit, Segregation of solid waste at the source, and solution to the common misconceptions regarding sanitation practices.

The above-mentioned goals have been achieved by adopting different methods of communication. From Workshops, Campaigns, Seminars, Special Drives, Practical Demonstrations, Community/Institutional engagement to aggressive use of print, audio, visual, electronic, digital, multimedia and mass media, etc.





Massive IEC campaign was launched to aware/encourage school going children in different activities promoting safe sanitation practices.



Painting Competitions, Quiz Competitions Marathons, Sanitation Drives and Awareness Programs were conducted across UT.

Swachhata Bank



These items encompass a range of materials such as polythene bags, plastic bottles, and wrappers from packets of chips, among others. The compensation is dispensed once the accumulated waste reaches a minimum measurable weight.

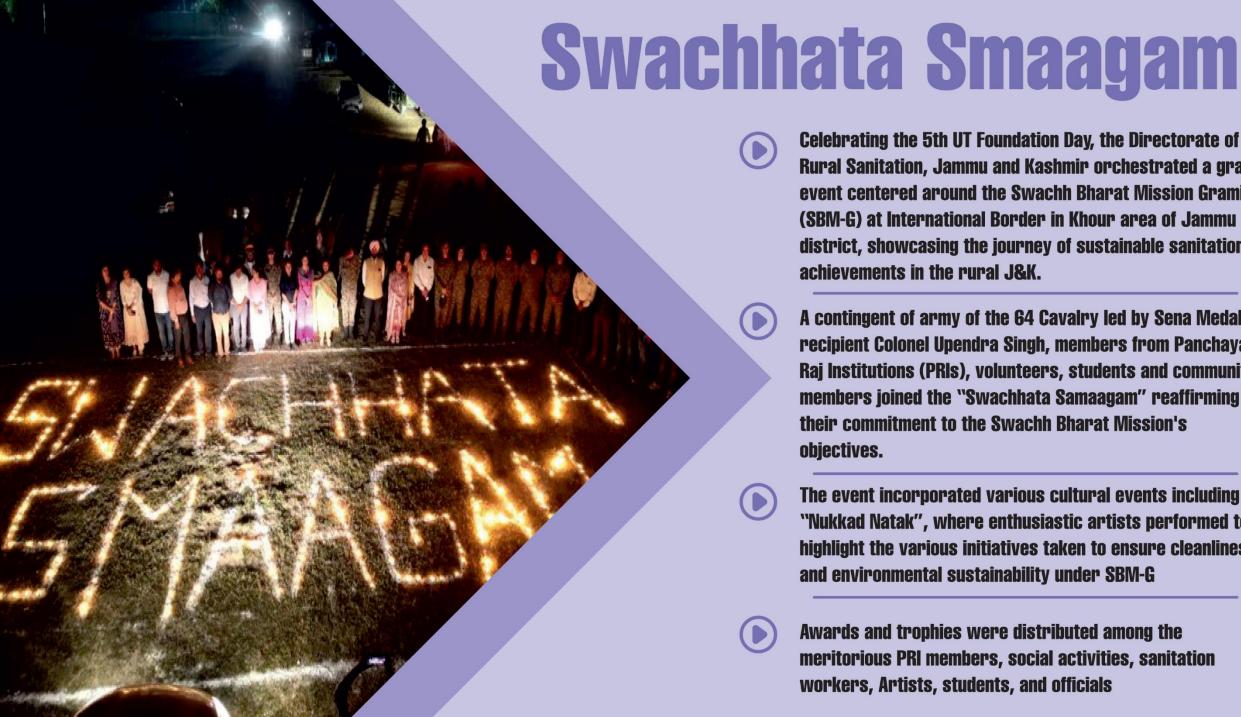


In exchange for this eco-friendly practice, participants are remunerated with an amount corresponding to the weight of the recyclable waste items they deposit



Core concept of the Swachhata Bank revolves around motivating individuals to open an account within the bank and subsequently deposit collected household plastic waste.

Plastic Waste Disposal in Kishtwar, Promoting Environmental Sustainability

The newly established unit is equipped with cutting-edge technology to efficiently collect, sort, and process plastic waste.

Through collaboration with the NHIDCL, the block PWMU will supply shredded plastic at a rate of Rs. 30 per kg.

The facility is expected to generate job opportunities for the local population, contributing to the district's economy. Furthermore, it aligns with both national and global initiatives promoting the circular economy and reducing the environmental impact of plastic waste.

The innovative idea gained support, leading to the quicktransformation of local areas into polythene-free zones.

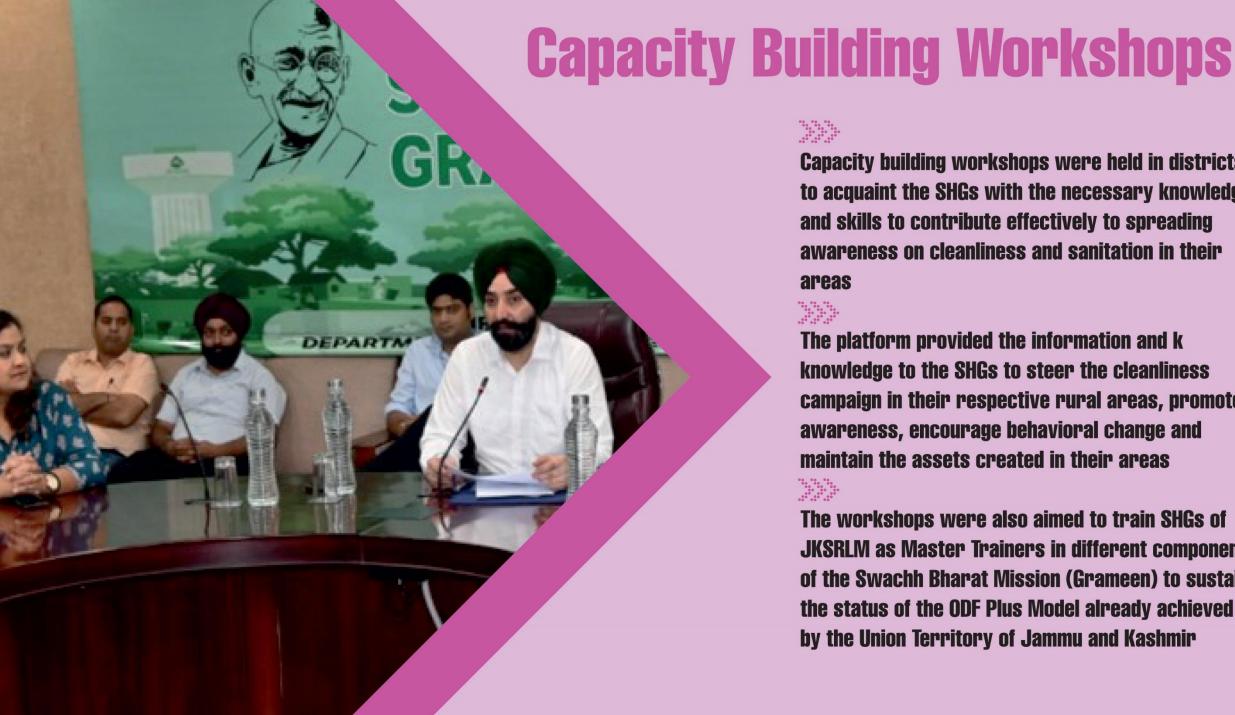


To incentivize plastic disposal, Sarpanch's spouse, Shabnum Farooq, donated two 10-gram gold coins, exchanging each for twenty quintals of plastic waste, emphasizing the commitment to environmental well-being



The initiative demonstrated that small incentives can be the right nudge for involving people in a process and creating a sense of ownership toward moral duties. Rewarding volunteers and sensitizing people were instrumental in achieving clean surroundings.

The campaign aimed to ensure that open defecationfree behaviours are sustained and that solid and liquid waste management facilities are accessible.

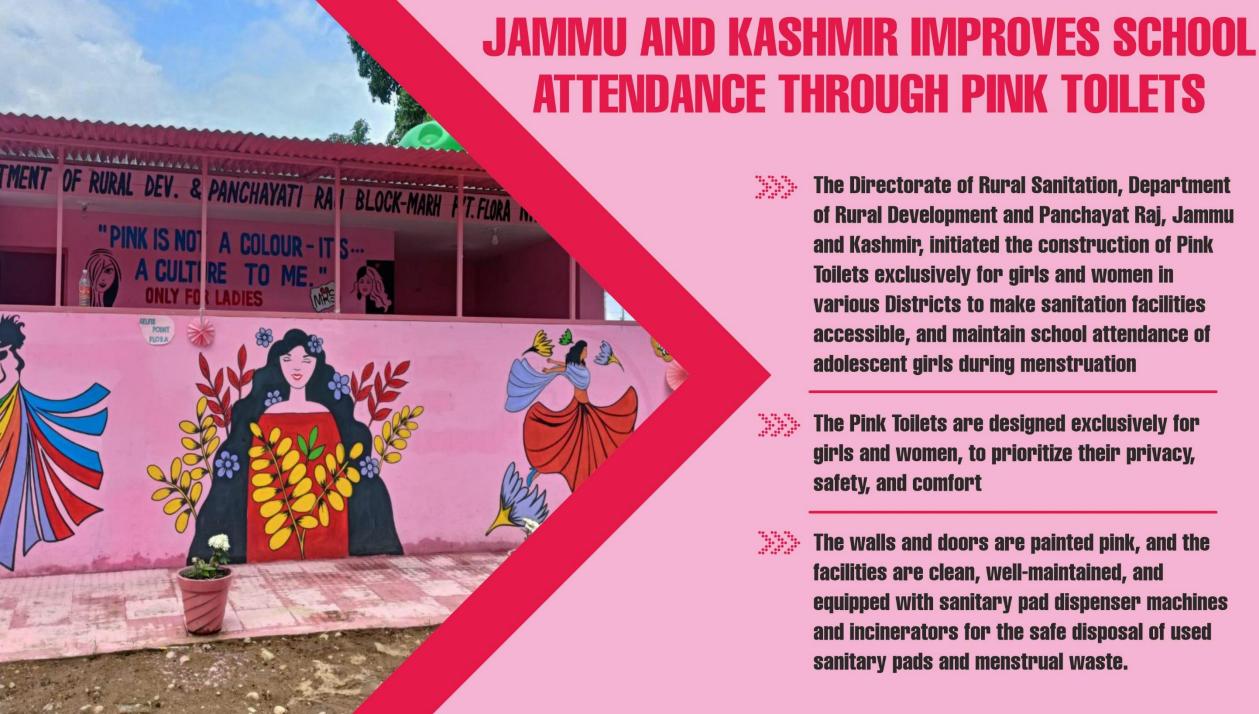


A pledge-taking ceremony was also organized in the GPs where the van travelled wherein the participants were administered the oath and motivated to involve themselves in cleanliness activities

The Directorate of Rural Sanitation, Department of Rural Development and Panchayat Raj, Jammu and Kashmir, initiated the construction of Pink Toilets exclusively for girls and women in various Districts to make sanitation facilities accessible, and maintain school attendance of adolescent girls during menstruation

The Pink Toilets are designed exclusively for girls and women, to prioritize their privacy, safety, and comfort

The walls and doors are painted pink, and the facilities are clean, well-maintained, and equipped with sanitary pad dispenser machines and incinerators for the safe disposal of used sanitary pads and menstrual waste.

Under this initiative, individuals who actively contribute by collecting and disposing of 10 kg of plastic waste from their villages will be eligible for the 'Plastic Neutral Citizen Certificate.



This certificate not only recognizes the individual's efforts in combating plastic pollution but also encourages others to participate in the campaign.
