





One of the cornerstones of this transformation was the establishment of a Solid Waste Processing Centre (SWPC), complete with a dedicated shed for systematic waste segregation and management. Regular community awareness campaigns on sanitation and waste segregation galvanized villagers into action, instilling a sense of ownership and responsibility.

These initiatives have not only made Thummalapalem a visually clean and sustainable GP, but also a model for others to emulate. The Panchayat has been recognized as a SWPC Supreme LTC for best practices in solid waste management and as a ODF+ Model Village for its comprehensive achievements in sanitation.

Smt. Malleswari's impact goes beyond infrastructure. A staunch advocate for women empowerment, she has actively involved women in village-level decision-making and cleanliness drives, fostering Mahila Sadikarata and proving that grassroots governance thrives when women lead.

One of the most impactful changes has been the construction of cement-concrete roads and drainage canals throughout the village. These developments have ensured that surplus rainwater and sewage no longer accumulate on roads, significantly improving hygiene and accessibility.

Kowlur has also adopted a community-driven waste management system, where green ambassadors collect segregated dry and wet waste from households and transport it to designated waste processing facilities. This initiative has fostered a cleaner environment and active civic participation.

The village has 100% toilet usage, with every resident using their individual household toilets. Ongoing awareness campaigns continue to reinforce the importance of sanitation and dignity.

To ensure safe drinking water, the Panchayat has implemented inline chlorination for its two Overhead Storage Reservoir (OHSR) tanks, guaranteeing clean water access for all residents.

Sri Udala Chinna Balaiah's leadership reflects a deep commitment to inclusive development and strategic resource utilization. His efforts have turned Kowlur into a model village—clean, organized, and forward-looking.

Under her leadership, Gotluru has become a model of effective solid waste management. The village has successfully implemented a door-to-door waste collection system using the Bin-Bag System, which is not only well-maintained but also owned and operated by the local community. Self Help Groups (SHGs) have played a pivotal role in raising awareness about waste segregation, with clap mitras educating households on separating wet and dry waste. 

Shri Ganpang Pansa -Transforming Kaimoi into the Cleanest Village in Longding District

aimoi, a gram panchayat in Longman Anchal of Longding district, Arunachal Pradesh, is home to 749 residents, primarily dependent on agriculture. With a literacy rate of just 24.43%, the village once faced challenges of unhygienic surroundings, free-roaming livestock, and limited sanitation and drinking water facilities.

Under the leadership of Shri Ganpang Pansa, Sarpanch of Kamoi, the Gram Panchayat has embarked on a remarkable journey of transformation. Inspired by the achievements of neighbouring award-winning villages, Shri Pansa mobilised the Village Development Committee, Village Water and Sanitation Committee (VWSC), women's groups, and youth to prioritise cleanliness, safe water access, and beautification.

Through the Swachh Bharat Mission–Grameen, Kaimoi constructed Individual Household Latrines, ensuring complete access to sanitation. Intensive IEC and BCC activities drove behavioural change, with community members adopting waste segregation, maintaining public spaces, and participating in cleanliness drives.

Under Jal Jeevan Mission, Kaimoi achieved 100% Functional Household Tap Connections (FHTCs), ensuring safe drinking water for every household. The VWSC successfully collected ₹2.17 lakh in water tariffs, reflecting strong community ownership of the scheme.

Shri Pansa institutionalised regular gram sabhas, launched a "Cleanest Colony Award" every two months, and encouraged stakeholder collaboration, leading to visible improvements. These efforts culminated in Kaimoi being awarded Cleanest Village in Longding District on Republic Day 2023 and Most Active VWSC in Arunachal Pradesh by the Hon'ble Chief Minister in March 2024.

Today, Kaimoi is known for its floral beauty, cleanliness, and hospitality, with plans to develop as a tourism destination. Shri Pansa's leadership has turned a vision of sanitation and safe water into a lived reality, embodying the spirit of Swatantrata Ka Utsav, Swachhata Ke Sang on this Independence Day.





Plastic segregation stores were set up in every village, with collected waste sent to the solid waste plant in Samirpur. Incinerators were installed for the safe disposal of sanitary pads, and compost pits were built for biodegradable waste. In two villages, drainage systems were linked to wastewater treatment tanks, while soak pits and kitchen gardens were developed in other households to manage greywater.

To promote health and hygiene, regular health camps are organized, and sanitary vending machines have been installed to support menstrual hygiene. For youth engagement, playgrounds have been developed, encouraging physical activity and community bonding.

Sikandar Panchayat also took a creative step in promoting cleanliness by painting eight sanitation slogans in each village, reinforcing awareness and pride in public hygiene. With two primary schools and one middle school, the Panchayat ensures access to education while maintaining a strong focus on infrastructure and civic responsibility.

n Himachal Pradesh's Shimla district, Gram Panchayat Thanedhar in Narkanda Block, has emerged as a shining example of rural transformation under the leadership of Pradhan Sandeep Kumar. His commitment to transparency, innovation and inclusive governance has not only improved infrastructure and sanitation but also empowered the community to take ownership of its development journey.

When the new Panchayat team took charge in 2021, they were immediately confronted with a pressing issue: unmanaged garbage. With no structured waste disposal system and the burden of hiring private vehicles for transportation, the Panchayat faced both logistical and financial challenges. Recognizing the urgency, Sarpanch Sandeep Kumar led the construction of a Segregation Shed and initiated door-to-door waste collection. But the real breakthrough came in 2022, when the Panchayat successfully applied for a Plastic Waste Management Plant under the Swachh Bharat Mission. To ensure sustainability, they also purchased their own pickup vehicle using Panchayat funds.

Today, Thanedhar has distributed color-coded dustbins to every household and extended its waste collection services to five neighboring Panchayats. Over 10,000 kg of plastic waste has been treated so far, making it a model for rural waste management in hilly terrains.

The Panchayat's commitment to environmental sustainability is further reflected in the Green Thanedhar Mission, under which more than 30,000 deodar trees have been planted in collaboration with the Forest Department and local residents. An annual month-long sanitation campaign involving the entire community reinforces civic responsibility and pride.

Transparency and digital engagement are at the heart of Thanedhar's governance model. The Panchayat maintains an active Facebook page, WhatsApp group, and website, where all developmental activities are shared publicly.

To promote women's empowerment, regular programs are organized to strengthen SHGs and encourage self-reliance. These efforts have earned the Panchayat two prestigious National Panchayat Awards in the financial year 2022–23:

QR codes have been distributed to every household and institution, enabling real-time tracking and improving transparency. Regular review meetings at the Panchayat, cluster, and consortium levels ensure continuous progress.

Creative campaigns have played a key role in driving behavioral change. Initiatives like Haritha Pathashala, Haritha Nyayapathashala, Plogathons, Swachhata Olympics, Radio Green Peralassery and Green Protocol enforcement have engaged children, youth and the wider community in environmental stewardship. The Panchayat strictly bans single-use plastics at public events, promoting reusable and eco-friendly alternatives.

n the coastal district of Kasaragod in Kerala, the North Trikaripur Gram Panchayat has emerged as a shining example of what committed leadership and community participation can achieve. Over 5,000 ring compost units and 210 Bokashi buckets were distributed to promote household-level organic waste treatment. In a pioneering move, 1,000 menstrual cups were distributed to reduce sanitary waste. The Panchayat also tackled illegal dumping near the railway station by converting the area into a beautifully landscaped garden with the help of voluntary organizations.

Digital tools and regular monitoring have ensured efficiency and transparency. Daily door-to-door collection is tracked, monthly review meetings are held, and user fee collection has reached 90%, significantly boosting the income of Haritha Karma Sena workers. For the first time in the state, a mini-crane has been installed at the MCF to handle heavy baled waste, showcasing Trikaripur's commitment to innovation.

Awareness campaigns and cleanliness competitions in schools and colleges have helped instill environmental values in the younger generation. All institutions have undergone green audits and grading, reinforcing the Panchayat's commitment to sustainability. In recognition of its achievements, Trikaripur Gram Panchayat has received several awards, including the Best MCF in the District and the Best Haritha Karma Sena in the Block.

n the hilly terrains of Arynad village, located in Vellanad block of Kerala's Thiruvananthapuram district, a remarkable transformation is underway. At the forefront of this change is Shri Viju Mohan V, the 60-year-old Sarpanch of Aryanad Gram Panchayat, whose leadership has turned his Panchayat into a model of sustainable development and environmental stewardship.

Spanning over 104.92 square kilometers and home to more than 33,000 people across 11,602 families — including Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe communities — Arynad has seen a series of impactful initiatives under Shri Mohan's guidance. Thirteen waste-strewn areas were cleaned, and green spaces were created in their place. To discourage littering, 33 bottle booths and 20 twin litter bins were installed and 21 CCTV cameras were set up.

In the realm of organic waste management, 3,800 bio-bins were distributed to households, and three community-level systems were established and are now operational. For non-organic waste, 37 Haritha Karma Sena members collect waste using push carts, which is then stored in 44 segregation sheds. An electric vehicle transports the waste to a 2,250 sq ft Material Collection Facility, where it is processed using modern machinery and supplied to cement companies.

Arynad's achievements have not gone unnoticed. On February 2, 2024, it was declared a litter-free village in Thiruvananthapuram district. On March 17, 2025, it reached another milestone—being declared a completely garbage-free village. Today, 34 offices, 11 schools, 33 anganwadis, and 2 colleges in the Panchayat proudly operate as green offices. A Kudumbashree enterprise also thrives here, crafting handicrafts from waste materials, adding a layer of economic empowerment to environmental responsibility.

n Maharashtra's Bhandara district, the small village of Paldongri has emerged as a beacon of rural transformation. In support of the plastic ban, cloth bags have been distributed to all households, significantly reducing plastic usage. Public dustbins have been installed at key locations, and menstrual hygiene management initiatives are actively promoted. The village has developed a closed drainage system, and 90 families have been equipped with individual soak pits for effective wastewater management.

All public institutions — including the Gram Panchayat office, schools, and anganwadis — are ISO certified and equipped with rainwater harvesting systems. Solar energy powers public infrastructure, further demonstrating Paldongri's commitment to sustainability. Under the "Har Ghar Nal Se Jal" initiative, every household receives 55 liters of clean tap drinking water per person per day. Water quality is ensured through regular testing, and a digital billing system with household water meters has been implemented for transparency and efficiency.

Paldongri's achievements have earned it widespread recognition. Under Shri Kharabe's leadership, the village has received numerous awards, including Smart Village Taluka-level Award (2023–24), Sant Gadgebaba Gram Swachhta Abhiyan District-level Second Prize, State-level Ideal Sarpanch Award by Lokmat Media Group (2024–25), Ideal Sarpanch Award by State-level Sarpanch Association (2024–25), Pandit Deendayal Upadhyay State-level Award (2018–19) and multiple Taluka, District, and Divisional-level awards under the Sant Gadgebaba Gram Swachhta Abhiyan (2016–18).

These accolades reflect not just administrative excellence but a deep-rooted culture of community participation. Monthly Gram Panchayat meetings and Gram Sabhas have been instrumental in raising awareness. SHGs have led the way in waste segregation and menstrual hygiene education, while student rallies, public beautification drives, and creative outreach through banners, wall paintings, and loudspeakers have reinforced the message of cleanliness and sustainability.

ust a few kilometers from Kolhapur city in Maharashtra, Nigve Dumala has emerged as a shining example of rural sanitation and solid waste management. With a population of 6,898 across 1,475 households, the village proudly holds Open Defecation Free (ODF) status and is now recognized for its scientific and community-driven approach to waste management. ahadarpur, a village in Rupnagar district, once struggled with irregular drinking water supply and poor sanitation facilities. Until 2013, residents depended on hand pumps and submersibles, with water available for only a few hours each day. Under the leadership of Sarpanch Mrs. Amandeep Kaur, the village embarked on a journey of transformation that changed daily life for every resident.

Her leadership brought the construction of a water supply scheme under NRDWP SWAP. Reluctance to take water connections was overcome as the system delivered reliable service. Today, Bahadarpur enjoys 24-hour water supply, 100% household tap connections, and Har Ghar Jal certification. Bills are paid through the mGram app, with ₹3.5 lakh in the GPWSC O&M account.

Under SBM-G, the village is 100% ODF Plus Model, with fully paved streets and a sewerage system. Funding for Solid and Liquid Waste Management has been secured, and work is underway on a Decentralized Wastewater Treatment System (DEWATS).

Her leadership has also encouraged innovation—one villager with 150 cattle supplies free cooking gas from his personal biogas plant to all households, promoting clean energy use.

Bahadarpur's work in sanitation and water supply was nationally recognised in 2015, when it received the Cleanest Village Award from the Hon'ble President of India.

alsana village in Patiala district faced drinking water shortages before 2010, relying on two submersible pumps that provided inadequate, non-potable water. Women walked long distances to fetch water, and health issues were common. Under Sarpanch Mr. Gurdhian Singh, this reality changed.

A water supply scheme was commissioned in 2010 under NRDWP SWAP, providing 10 hours of continuous, potable water supply daily. Villagers pay a nominal connection fee, and the GPWSC O&M account remains healthy, ensuring sustainability.

Under SBM-G Phase I, toilets were constructed for households without sanitation facilities, and by 2017, the village was declared ODF. In Phase II, Kalsana developed Solid Waste Management units, Liquid Waste Management systems, and Community Sanitary Complexes, creating a cleaner environment.

His leadership has inspired nearby villages—Raisal, Sirinagar, and Mallewal Patti—to adopt similar zero-waste approaches, including segregation, composting, and resource recovery.

The village also runs health and hygiene camps, Swachhata Hi Seva campaigns, and school awareness drives, making cleanliness a shared responsibility.

That same year, a new RO water purifier plant was installed to ensure clean drinking water for residents. In 2024, free pattas were distributed to 16 villagers, and 24 families received new homes under the KKVT government scheme. The year 2025 marked the construction of a new Panchayat office, courtyard shelter, and a bus stand, along with the development of a playground for tennis, cricket, and kabaddi.

Sarpanch Karthikeyan also prioritized sanitation, ensuring every household had access to toilets, and led regular Gram Sabha meetings—24 in total over four years. His commitment to health was evident through the organization of three annual medical camps and the restoration of village roads and water reservoirs for better conservation. His support for women's empowerment through self-help groups and vocational training, and his engagement with youth through education and sports, have further strengthened the social fabric of the village. He also championed digital services to promote transparency in governance.

In recognition of his loyalty and dedication—especially for the New Samudhaya Kudam—he received appreciation and greetings from the Member of Parliament. His contributions earned him the honour of being invited as a Special Guest to the Independence Day celebrations at the Red Fort, a moment of pride for the entire Porpandal community.

Sarpanch Karthikeyan's story is a testament to the power of visionary leadership, mentorship, and the impact of dedicated public service.

Shri Apurba Poddar Leads Salema's Sanitation Success Story

n the Salema Block of Dhalai district, Tripura, the village of Salema has undergone a remarkable transformation under the leadership of Shri Apurba Poddar, the 58-year-old Sarpanch of Salema Gram Panchayat. Once burdened by poor sanitation and limited access to clean water, the Panchayat now stands as a model of sustainable development and proactive governance.

Tripura declared itself Open Defecation Free (ODF) in March 2019, but Salema Gram Panchayat went further — building a comprehensive sanitation ecosystem that addresses not just toilets, but also solid and liquid waste management and hygiene education. With strategic use of Swachh Bharat Mission – Gramin (SBM-G) assets, the Panchayat constructed a segregation shed, the cornerstone of its solid waste management framework.

To promote plastic discipline, 25 Plastic Banks were installed across the Panchayat and market areas. For greywater management, eight soak pits were developed at institutional and community levels, preventing stagnation and improving public health. The Panchayat also built two compost pits, converting biodegradable waste into organic fertilizer for local farmers.

At the household level, every family received dustbins, encouraging waste segregation at source. Additionally, six drainage systems were constructed to prevent waterlogging, especially during the monsoon season.

Water access, once a major challenge for Salema's residents, has been revolutionized through the Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM). Today, all 805 households receive purified piped water, eliminating the need for long-distance water collection. Public institutions, including two schools, four Anganwadi centres, and government offices such as the Panchayat office, forest office and police station, are also covered under JJM.

These efforts have not only improved sanitation and water access but have also elevated the quality of life for every resident of Salema Gram Panchayat.

In recognition of his outstanding leadership and the Panchayat's achievements in sanitation and water management, Shri Apurba Poddar has been invited as a special guest to the Independence Day celebrations at the Red Fort.
